
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Marist 2024 Theme

Communication

Important communication will come to you via email, Seesaw, Newsletter, SMS text and SEQTA. Reports go live on <u>SEQTA Engage</u> at the end of each semester. Real time results and progress marks in secondary school are visible through the assessment tab on <u>SEQTA Engage</u>. The <u>College website</u>, <u>Calendar</u>, <u>Facebook</u>, <u>Instagram</u>, <u>Twitter</u> and <u>LinkedIn</u> are very important tools for communication and celebration. We encourage you to follow us on all our social media pages.

Teaching and Learning Technology

The College uses Teams and OneNote as the sole delivery and engagement platform for student learning in Secondary. Training in the usage of Teams and OneNote begins from Year 4. Seesaw is operational in the Primary years as a teaching and learning tool.

College owned and managed iPads are now operational from Years 2 to 4. We are phasing out the Bring Your Own iPad Program in the Primary, in favour of College-owned and managed devices. Year 5 and 6 will continue with providing their own iPad. From Year 7, students are asked to purchase a Bring Your Own Nominated Device, as communicated by ICT.

Newman College Norms

Our *Vision for Learning – Let your light shine (Matthew 5:16)* reflects the Marist charism of Newman College and our unwavering belief that all members of our community can develop their unique abilities. To live out this vision to its truest potential, we respect and agree to a series of reasonable 'non-negotiables'. The <u>Newman College Norms</u> bring expectation to light and therefore promote psychological safety for all community members.

Code of Conduct

At Newman College we recognise that effective learning can only occur in a secure environment where the rights and responsibilities of others are known and respected and where standards and rules are fairly and consistently applied.

Managing the Code of Conduct is a shared responsibility between <u>students</u>, <u>parents/guardians</u>, and the College. We are expected to uphold the values of Newman College, not only at school but also in the community.

Response Times

It is reasonable for teachers, students and parents to expect assessments to be marked and returned within a two-week period. This timeframe reflects the busy nature of a teaching timetable whilst also recognising the importance of timely feedback for learning.

When contacting the College, it is reasonable for College staff to respond within two school days. This reflects the teachers' priority to prepare and teach classes and the right to disconnect outside of work hours, whilst also honouring the need to remain in close contact with parents and students.



Capital Development

Newman College is embarking on a generational development that will see our Pre-Kindy to Year 12 community united for the first time in our history on a single campus. The program will see all learning and specialty areas of the primary school rebuilt to accommodate state-of-the-art teaching and learning practices, in line with the College's vision for learning *'Shine through Discovery – Let your light shine'* (Matthew 5:16).

The staged development will see the creation of the following spaces timetabled as follows:

- New Primary Administration building: February 2024
- New Year 3 to Year 6 building: April 2024
- Covered playing court area: April 2024
- Redevelopment of the Lavalla site Kindergarten to Year 2 building: February 2025
- New Pre-Kindy building: February 2025
- Creation of new specialty areas such as Library, Art, Music, and STEM: February 2025
- New outdoor play spaces: February 2025

The integration of the primary campuses onto a single site will allow for greater access to the College's considerable facilities, including: the heated 50m Olympic size swimming pool, 600 seat Auditorium, dance studios and instrumental rehearsal spaces, multiple playing fields, Chapel and the St John Henry Newman Learning Hub. Furthermore, the single site will allow for the consistent involvement of leaders, teachers and specialty staff throughout the Pre-Kindy to Year 12 community.
